The Regional Secretariat of the Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security and the Government of the Republic of Indonesia, hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as "the Parties";

RECALLING the Coral Triangle Initiative Leader's Declaration on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security, signed on 15 May 2009 in Manado, Indonesia, which, inter alia, emphasized the need to establish a Secretariat to service the ongoing Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security implementation process;

REFERRING to the Agreement on the Establishment of the Regional Secretariat of the Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security along with the regulations thereon signed on 28 October, 2011 in Jakarta, Indonesia;

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:



- a. "The Government" means the Government of the Republic of Indonesia;
- "The CTI-CFF" means the Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security;
- c. "The Secretariat" means the Regional Secretariat of the CTI-CFF;

DONE in Manado on the $.1^{\infty}$ of December 2015, in two original copies in Indonesian and English languages, all texts being equally authentic. In the event of any divergence of interpretation between any of the texts, the English text shall prevail.

 Status as an International Organization: Based on your advices we note that CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat is generally recognized in Indonesia as an inter-governmental organization with certain degree of privileges and immunities but not a full diplomatic immunity.


[M&T: Your understanding is correct, i.e. that:

(i) The CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat ("CTI-CFF") may fall under the definition of an international organization under Presidential Decree No. 64 of 1999 on Indonesia's Membership of and the Indonesian Government's Contributions to, International Organizations and Law No. 24 of 2000 on International Agreements; Legal analysis conducted by Makarim & Taira S, one of Indonesia's leading business law firms – gave two analyses – 31 January 2019 and 13 March 2018 based on issues/comments raised by CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat
