Progress of CTI-CFF Seascapes TWG

- The 1st Seascape TWG meeting was held on 16-17 April 2013 in Bali, Indonesia
 - Developed the SWG TOR
 - Work Plan for 2014, which was mandated by SOM8, was approved
 - Established definition of CTI Seascape
- The 2nd CTI CFF Regional Priority Workshop held 20-22 August 2013 in Manado
 - Prioritized Regional Action1, Target 2: adopt a general "model" for the sustainable management of seascapes and
 - Regional Action 2, Target 2: Establish seascape capacity-building and learning mechanism;

Progress of CTI-CFF Seascapes TWG

- In 2014 the 1st Regional Exchange on Seascapes and the 2nd Seascapes WG meeting was conducted in Manila, Philippines.
 - Promoted integration through the participation of resource persons and CT6 representatives from across 5 Technical Working Groups
 - Reviewed Seascapes and integrated EBM approach
 - Began development of CTI Seascapes Model

UPDATE OF NATIONAL SEASCAPES ACTIVITY

Timor-Leste: Timor-Leste Seascape

- Analysis of priority north coast sites for fisheries replenishment
- Replication of co-management approach in future sites to link at larger scale

Philippines: West Philippine Sea Seascape

First Draft Strategic Action Plan for network of marine protected areas completed in 2013

Solomon Islands: BSSE

- National consultations specifically on linkages between MSP and BSSE
- Discussions on rising threat of deep-sea mining between PNG and SI
- Identification of the need for threat-value assessment of offshore activities including establishing large-scale managed areas for fishing activities

UPDATE OF NATIONAL SEASCAPES ACTIVITY

Indonesia: Bird's Head Seascape

- Marine spatial plan for Bird's Head Seascape is established and in the process of endorsement/legalization
- Sustainable financing mechanism is in the process of establishment

Indonesia: Bastunamata Seascape (Anambas-Natuna-Karimata)

- Profile on the Bastunamata Seascape completed and ready for distribution
- Management plan for Anambas marine protected areas, Pieh Island and its network within Seascape is in the process of approval
- Sustainable financing system is initiated

UPDATE OF NATIONAL SEASCAPES ACTIVITY

Indonesia: Banda Seascape

- Baseline ecological data to inform resource use maps and boundary maps for the proposed 150,000 hectare (ha) East Flores MPA
- Alor MPA zoning plan and related regulations have been approved and granted legal status by the Alor Regent (Bupati).
- Development of a regional M&E framework for the Banda Seascape

Indonesia: Lesser Sunda Seascape

- Savu Sea Marine National Park was established 2014
- MPA Zoning plan and related regulations have been approved and granted legal status by Minister of Marine Affairs and Fisheries of Indonesia (MMAF)
- Lesser Sunda Marine Spatial Planning has been initiated, including MSP of Regencies and Municipalities; (NTT, Rote Ndao, etc.)

Possible Trans-boundary Seascapes

- <u>North :</u> Sulu Sulawesi Seascape →Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines;
- <u>South :</u> Lesser Sunda Seascape →Indonesia, Timor Leste, Australia
- <u>West :</u> Sunda Self → Bastunamata: Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore
- East : Papua-Bismarck Solomon Sea → Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Palau

WORKING GROUP ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2015

- Development of 1st Draft of Seascapes Model and Framework, presented to SWG, at Pacific mini-REX, and to be presented at SEA mini-REX to gather input towards 2nd draft
- Seascapes Pacific Mini-Regional Exchange, held at the University of Queensland in Brisbane, Australia from September 29-October 1, 2015
- Seascapes Southeast Asian Mini-Regional Exchange, to be held at Hyatt Regency Kota Kinabalu in Kota Kinabalu, Malaysia from December 8-10, 2015
- × Development of Seascapes guidance and knowledge materials including audiovisuals
- Conference calls involving members of the SWG, CT6, RS and Development Partners throughout the year
- Secured continued financial support from the Government of Australia and technical support from Conservation International and the Nature Conservancy
- Continued to promote integration within CTI-CFF with active participation of CT6 representatives and resource people from other TWGs and M&E WG
