 - CCA regional actions for capacity building, financing, and establishing CCA
 Centers of Excellence
 - Climate Change Adaptation Marketplace
 - Region-wide threatened species conservation and management action plans
- Broadening scope of CT6 sector engagement in CTI (e.g. tourism, planning agencies)
- Consider simplification of CT structure/integration of TWGs
