# BRIEF BACKGROUND/HISTORY

- The PNG Marine Program accommodates the PNG National Plan of Action.
- Extends beyond the CTI boundary to include the southern region of the country where the Torres Strait Treaty covers. All maritime provinces.
- National Coordination Committee with representations from relevant government agencies, NGO partners and Institutions that deliberates on CTI matters.
- CTI NCC Secretariat is provided for within CEPA with support from the NCC.
- Alignment of relevant Government policies and initiatives for the marine and coastal sector.

Each of the 5 goals of the RPOA are coordinated and implemented by respective Government agencies Focal Points in the country. Partnerships with NGO partners and institutions.

# LESSONS LEARNED

- A Monitoring and Evaluation system is vital for any review.
- Data and information management/ sharing is very important to ensure informed decisions.
- Its more effective to work with a bottom-up approach than a top-down approach so the communities take ownership of these initiatives.
- Local communities are better educated through educational awareness programs and their appreciation on the importance of sustaining livelihoods and food security.
- Regular and constant communications and reporting from stakeholders and partners is important to inform NCC so they are kept informed to make better informed decisions.
- Effective implementation with support from stakeholders and partners.



# CHALLENGES

- Institutional and human capacity
- Budget limitations.
- Insufficient Information Flow.
- Lack of timely communications and reporting by stakeholders and partners.
- Coordination and facilitation among stakeholders.
- Sharing of data and information. Scattered data and data security.
- Replication of projects in other areas. Requests by local communities to see those activities also implemented in their communities.
- Lack of legal and policy enforcement.



## RECOMMENDATIONS

- Increased resources for effective implementation.
- Build capacity of provincial and local government Administrations for effective implementations.
- Increased linkages/ involvement of NCC in projects formulation.
- Timely and constant communications, reporting and submission of updates by stakeholders and partners.
- Commitments and support from existing partners and stakeholders.
- Commitment and support from additional partners and stakeholders.
- Cross learning between different programs and countries is encouraged.
