- *Mainstreaming of the goals and actions of the CTI-NPOA to the local government plans
- →Peace and Order
- →Limited logistics of local law enforcement teams
- *Lack of support for the operations of the Regional Working Groups
- **★2016** National Elections may change the priorities of national agencies and local government units

- ◆Review the NPOA implementation articulate the higher level targets and determine the financial gaps in the NPOA
- ◆Pilot various modalities for sustainable finance and ensure policy support for sustainable financing
