SOLOMON ISLANDS

- 992 islands
- Total land area 28,000km²
- Total sea area 1,340,000km²
- Total coral reef area 3,591km²
- Total mangrove area 65,000ha
- Total seagrass area 10,000ha

80% of land is under Customary Tenure (recognized by Constitution).





• Population (2009 Census) : 515,870

Annual growth rate: 3.5%

Diverse culture and people:

 Melanesians (highest), Polynesians and Micronesians

- ~ 80 different languages

Dual economy: formal and informal

- **Commercial:** natural resource dependent on forestry, fisheries, copra, cocoa, etc . Limited manufacturing and processing exist.

- Subsistence: fishers, farmers

85% of people live in rural communities = <u>heavily depend on the</u> land & sea resources for food, income and livelihood.

VISION

Marine and coastal resources are sustainably managed and utilised to secure the long term improvement of the livelihoods of Solomon Islanders.

GOAL

Solomon Islands sustainably manages marine and coastal resources to ensure food security, sustainable development, biodiversity conservation and adaptation to emerging threats through community-based resource management approaches supported by government agencies and other partners.

TARGETS1

2015:

• 25% of Solomon Islands coastal, watershed and inshore area under 40% improved management through CBRM and ICM approaches by 2015.

2020:

50% of Solomon Island coastal, watershed and inshore area under improved managed through CBRM and ICM approaches by 2020.

- Conflicting priorities for financial/technical support e.g. CC & MPAs & Fisheries management
- Weak enforcement and compliance



RECOMMENDATIONS

- Need for strategic/upscaling regional and national support for implementation
- Regional/National exchanges, learning and capacity building
- Better coordination between CT6 countries and Regional secretariat.
- Improved communications between Regional Assistance Projects meeting national priorities/needs.
- Expand CTI national/regional partners and network
