
### Indonesia MPA Location/Distribution









### **Issues and Challenges**

- Project timeframe → 2 years project period is only the starting point, it needs more time to get a holistic and further activities
- Policy changes → Transfer of MPA management authority from Regency Government to Provincial Government (Law No.32/2014)
- Changes from SSME to CTI-CFF → needs new IA
- The coverage of working area is limited → GIZ worked only in FMA 716, while fisheries management area is connected one another.

### **Lessons learned**

- Appointed people that sit in the Office are important → easy coordination & build trust
- Regular/routine meeting to track progress, planning next activity and overcome challenges are important
- Joint activity between Province & District builds cooperation among them
- Leader instruction is crucial
- It is necessary to improve the coordination between the parties involved in project implementation
- It is necessary to ensure the capability of the community in pilot area to sustain the financial needs

## Ways forward - Beyond the project

- Formulate/develops concrete joint management action/plans based on connectivity and characteristics between 3 countries. Regional MPA Networks?
- Concrete actions to make Berau MPA as an marine ecotourism destination to improve community welfare/livelihood
- Continuous education, coaching and technical assistance for local fishermen to implement fishing business practices that environmentally sustainable and economically feasible
- Berau MPA Management effectiveness improvement through
  - Accelerate endorsement of East Kalimantan Provincial Marine Spatial Plan
  - Definitive Berau MPA management unit
  - Partnership and support for Berau MPA Management from government partners (NGO,local community groups, university, private sectors)
  - Routine enforcement and surveillance
  - Community empowerment and partnership
- Very welcome to future project/initiative from other donor
- Implementation of EAFM and Fisheries Management Councils in 11 Indonesia's Fisheries Management Areas
