The Roles of Local Governments in CTI-CFF

- There are three (3) Authorities:
 - Global Authority (UN) / Regional (CTI) = Global / Regional Policy and Network
 - National Authority = National Policy and Regulation
 - Local Authority (autonomy): Political commitment (local Budget) and execute program/project at grass root level
- The Important of Local Authority is as the place of:
 - 1. Natural Resources
 - 2. Community
 - 3. Local Indigenous Leader

Poverty, flood, slums, hunger, Biodivessity distructive and other social problem directly face to face (100%) with Local Authority

The Roles of Local Governments in CTI-CFF

- Thefore Local Government (municipality based) is a backbone in their respective countries in implementing the NPOA at the grass root level (real local budget and political program/political)
- CTI-CFF LGN is the only media to encourage Local Authorities within CTI Countries to direct implement the CTI-CFF program at grass root level above
