- Participation and representation (WLF) during the ADB 50th Annual Meeting in Japan 2017

Goal 1: Prority seascapes designated and effectively managed

Achievements

- Developed a national Seascapes Roadmap (Seascapes NCC TWG) as guide towards establishment of potential "priority seascapes".

- Initiated Marine Spatial Planning process

Challenges

- Limited technical and institutional capacity for large-scale marine planning and management still learning
- Jurisdictional matters communities v.s provinces v.s national government/ inshore v.s offshore priorities
- Engagement of private sector into the national discussions

- Socialize Seascapes General Model and Regional Framework for national implementation
- Pilot test the General Model on a selected national seascape
- Seek support towards seascapes implementation from development partners (national/regional and international)

Goal 2: Ecosystems approach to management of fisheries and other marine resources is fully applied

Achievements

- Developed MFMR Strategic and Corporate Plan
- Completed Finfish market surveys Honiara and Western Province
- Completed Invertebrates survey Honiara
- Support to establishment of Constituency Fisheries Centers = 16 target sites
- Establishment /capacity building for new CBRM Unit within MFMR
- Expansion/support of FAD Program (livelihoods and food security)
- Supporting Partners projects R2R, Provincial networking and exchanges, research, women empowerment through micro-financing schemes
- Expansion of Seaweed Farming
- Complete phase 1- Pilot research of sea-cucumber (peanut fish) breeding and hatchery Guadalcanal Province

Challenges

- Remoteness access to EAFM information and support
- Limited finance, technical capacity and human resources
- Research expansion support
- Price fluctuations of the world market

- Complete Lata and Malaita market surveys and analysis
- Development of MFMR CBRM policies
- Finalize fisheries inshore regulations for gazettal
- Development of Aquatic Biosecurity Guidelines (Aquaculture)
- Expansion of Sea-cucumber research sites
- Hand over of CFCs to constituencies







Goal 3: Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) established and effectively managed

Achievements

- Officially declared the first National Marine Park in SI under the PA Act 2010, the Arnavons Community Marine Park (in collaboration with Choiseul and Isabel Provincial Governments, TNC and ACMCA).
- Submission of MPAs/MMAs (use of CT Atlas) into SPREP Protected Areas Portal, WDPA and SOLGEO platforms.

• Challenges

- Consistent updating of MPAs, MMAs and taboos into the national and regional M&E platforms time and capacity issues
- Data sharing and feedback from implementing partners and communities

- Update status of MPAs or MMAs in CT Atlas and other relevant platforms (BIOPAMA & WDPA)
- Finalize SI MPA Management Effectiveness Tool (SI MAME tool)
- Progress official designations of other managed marine areas (submissions or EOIs made) under the Fisheries Management Act or Protected Areas Act.
- Ongoing training and awareness

Goal 4: Climate change adaptation measures achieved

Achievements

- Kick-start development of CC Legislation drafting instructions
- REAP and LEAP as guide for implementation by CCA partners and projects
- Completed the V&A assessment profile for Choiseul Province
- Re-vitalized the National Climate Change Working Group
- Establish within CCD Geospatial Unit for CC data storage and analysis pla
- Introduction through CCATWG Blue Carbon initiative

Challenges

- Competing priorities marine sector low support vs. land-based CCA activi
- Limited capacity technical and financial
- Most projects occur in Western Bloc of SI needed attention for eastern parts

- Finalize drafting of Climate Change Bill for submission to Cabinet
- Review National Climate Change Policy (opportunity to include BC and ocean focus)
- Initiate the second provincial-wide V&A assessment (Malaita Province)



Goal 5: Threatened species status improving

- Achievements
- Gazettal of the Wildlife Protection and Management Amendment Act 2017
- Completed national Sharks list

Challenges

- Limited government budgets for threatened species programs
- Limited capacity technical, financial and institutional for protection and management of TS
- Data-sharing issues

- Finalize regulations for FMA 2015 and WPMA (Amendment) 2017
- Review and Update the National Marine Turtles Action Plan
- Develop the dugongs and seagrass management strategy
- Develop Coral Management Plan
