CCA Decision 1: Approval of a CTI Ministerial Communiqué on Climate Change to be presented in Cancun at a UNFCCC-related event

Climate change policy and coastal management specialists, with NCC and CCA Focal Points from the CT6 countries met in Jakarta, Indonesia from October 21-23, 2010 at the *Regional Policy and Action Planning for Climate Change Adaptation in the Coral Triangle Countries*, a Regional Exchange and Workshop in support of the CTI. One of the recommendations was a CCA Communiqué from the CTI be presented to the global community at UNFCCC COP 16 in Cancun to indicate the progress of the CTI on CCA and its common policy positions related to UNFCCC Treaty.

CCA Decision 1A:

The *DRAFT CTI Ministerial Communiqué on Climate Change* (Attachment 1) is accepted and referred to a small CTI Climate Change drafting team determined by the CCA Focal Points to be further reviewed, revised and approved by the CT 6 Ministers for signing and presentation in Cancun a UNFCCC-related event.

CCA Decision 2: CTI CCA Working Group and CCA Roadmap Events

In order to guide and coordinate the newly begun CCA-related regional and national CTI activities, the CT6 CCA representatives attending the October 2010 CCA Policy Regional Exchange, and the CT6 CCA Focal Points recommend the SOM establish a “pilot” CCA Technical Working Group “for now” until May 2011’s *CTI Regional Priority Actions and Coordination Workshop*, or until the CMWG, the CT6 MPA Focal Points and the CTI Permanent Regional Secretariat have met to discuss and recommend a longer-term mechanism. Indonesia and Solomon Islands have offered to co-chair the Technical Working Group, and Indonesia has offered to house a one person secretariat for support. An initial Terms of Reference for the work to be guided and coordinated is attached (Attachment 2). The CCA Road Map of activities in attached (Attachment 3).

CCA Decision 2A:

A “pilot” CTI CCA Technical Working Group is established, co-chaired by (Indonesia and Solomon Islands). Members will include the CT6 CCA Focal Points or their consistent designee, and an invited set of CCA Short Course graduates, and invited partners (primarily those that are supporting CCA regional and national activities in 2010-2011, to be defined by the CCA Focal Points). The CCA TWG will plan, oversee, implement and report on a set of CCA activities defined by the CTI Roadmap for 2010-2011.

The CCA Technical Working Group’s initial responsibilities include managing the following CTI CCA Road Map Events and efforts for 2010-2011 listed below, among others that arise:

- Completing the Ministerial Communiqué, related communication materials and other event plans for UNFCCC-related events in Cancun at COP 16;
- Planning and conducting a Regional Exchange on CCA Implementation, to be held in Solomon Islands in the first half of 2011 and based on the concept developed in Oct 2010 at the CCA Policy Workshop;
- Continuing development of the CTI Region-Wide Early Action Plan for CCA (REAP-CCA) for SOM 7 review, based on the draft created in October 2010 at the CCA Policy Workshop;
- Continuing a comparative policy review towards identifying common ground in policy foras, and data sharing towards mapping vulnerability and resilience for Early Actions for presentation at SOM 7.

CCA Decision 3: CTI CCA Development of a Climate Adaptation Funding Marketplace

As adaptation is often limited by access to funding, the participants of the CCA Policy Regional Exchange recommend that the CTI pursue an offer to develop a “Funding Marketplace” for Climate Adaptation. The Coral Triangle Adaptation

Marketplace aims to provide project developers with essential funding information for coastal and marine adaptation projects, presented in an efficient and more accessible format. It is envisioned to become a platform for more innovative thinking and creative partnerships on climate change adaptation. (See Attachment 4)
