

The Internal Resource Committee (IRC) Meeting





Happy Independence Day, Papua New Guinea!






CTI-CFF YOUTH AMBASADOR PROGRAM (YAP) 2023



The broader impact envisions the acceptance of the revised Training Module for continued use beyond 2023, facilitated by the proposed GESI Hub in 2024, marking a milestone in our commitment to fostering inclusive practices and sustainable fisheries in Southeast Asia.
