



CTI-CFF Youth Ambassadors Program Online Capacity Building activities 23, 27 and 30 August 2024 via Zoom Link and CTI-CFF Regional Youth and Young Professionals Workshop on Sustainable Fisheries Management II – I3 September 2024 in Bangkok, Thailand

Objective

Capacity Building (August 2024):

- To support the initial recruitment and implementation of the 2nd cohort of Youth Ambassadors and Young Professionals Program.
- To conduct online capacity-building activities (i.e., mentorship and/or sharing & learning sessions) on sustainable fisheries management integrated with coastal and marine ecosystems, climate change, unsustainable fisheries, IUU fishing, coastal livelihoods, and fair labor, among others.
- To provide expert mentorship to youth and young professionals in effective communication especially articulating their experiences and ideas.
- To provide guidance to ensure continuity/sustainability of the YAP program on behalf of CTI-CFF

<u>CTI-CFF Regional Youth and Young Professionals Workshop on Sustainable Fisheries Management (11 – 13 September 2024)</u>:

- Obtain inputs from the youth and young professionals for the 2030 CTI-CFF Young Professionals and Youth Development Roadmap
- To provide capacity building on coastal and marine ecosystems, climate change, unsustainable fisheries, IUU fishing, coastal livelihoods, and fair labor;
- To provide a platform for participants to build regional network, share stories, experiences, plans and aspirations addressing issues surrounding unsustainable and IUU fishing, marine conservation, the loss of marine biodiversity, and addressing human rights and justice issues related to marine fisheries management.

Expected outputs and outcome:

- A Call to Action (CTA) from delegates from respective countries addressing specific challenges and opportunities in relation to coastal and marine resources and issues.
- Published stories or experiences of the youth and young professionals on the official website and social media channels of GYC, CTI-CFF, USAID, and Tetra Tech (subject to USAID/RDMA approval) in order to increase the visibility of the program to others outside the CTI and ASEAN region.
- Draft 2030 CTI-CFF Young Professionals and Youth Development Roadmap for presentation at SOM-19 under WLF.A network of CTI-CFF Youth Ambassadors and Young Professionals established, composed initially of youth and young professionals who participated in the first cohort of YAP in 2023 from CT6 and Vietnam, and the second cohort in 2024 from CT6, Vietnam and Thailand. It is expected that as YAP expands, youth and young professionals from other countries in Southeast Asia will also participate. Representation from stateless and marginalized groups from the fisheries sector is encouraged.
- Youth and young professionals in the Indo-Pacific region are empowered and equipped to advocate and/or manage marine biodiversity and fisheries resources with GESI sensitivity and leadership skills, to make positive contributions to their communities and
