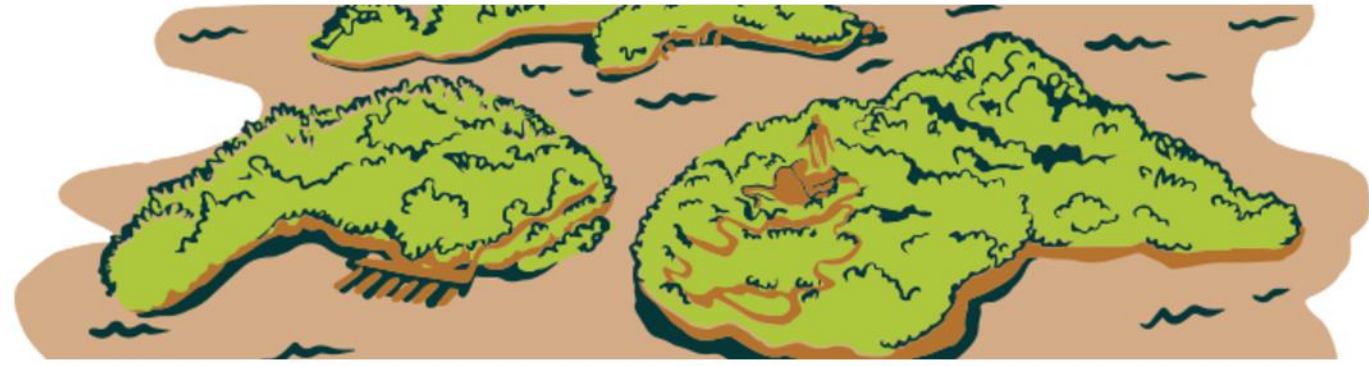


WLF-related SOM-18 updates

1	Protection and empowerment small scale fishers
2	EU Streit Program Connected 10,000 women to the formal financial system in the Greater Sepik region. EU STREIT program launched another FAO-Thiaroye Technique (FTT) site for enhanced fish processing in Angoram District, East Sepik Province. The FTT is handed over to Kandangapma Women's Business Group with a total of 325 fisherwomen.
3	Craft boats donated to fishers to drive the sustainable development of the fisheries value chain in Sepik region.
4	Continuation of deployment activities for the 14 maritime provinces
5	Baseline assessment of monitoring sites prior to IFAD deployment
6	Ongoing community and stakeholders' consultation
7	Training on Tails data collection app
8	Surveys of new additional fishing grounds in Manus and New Ireland Provinces.
9	Training on management plan, fisheries law and data collection for village data recorders as part of socializing the draft artisanal management plan (Nov-Dec 2023)

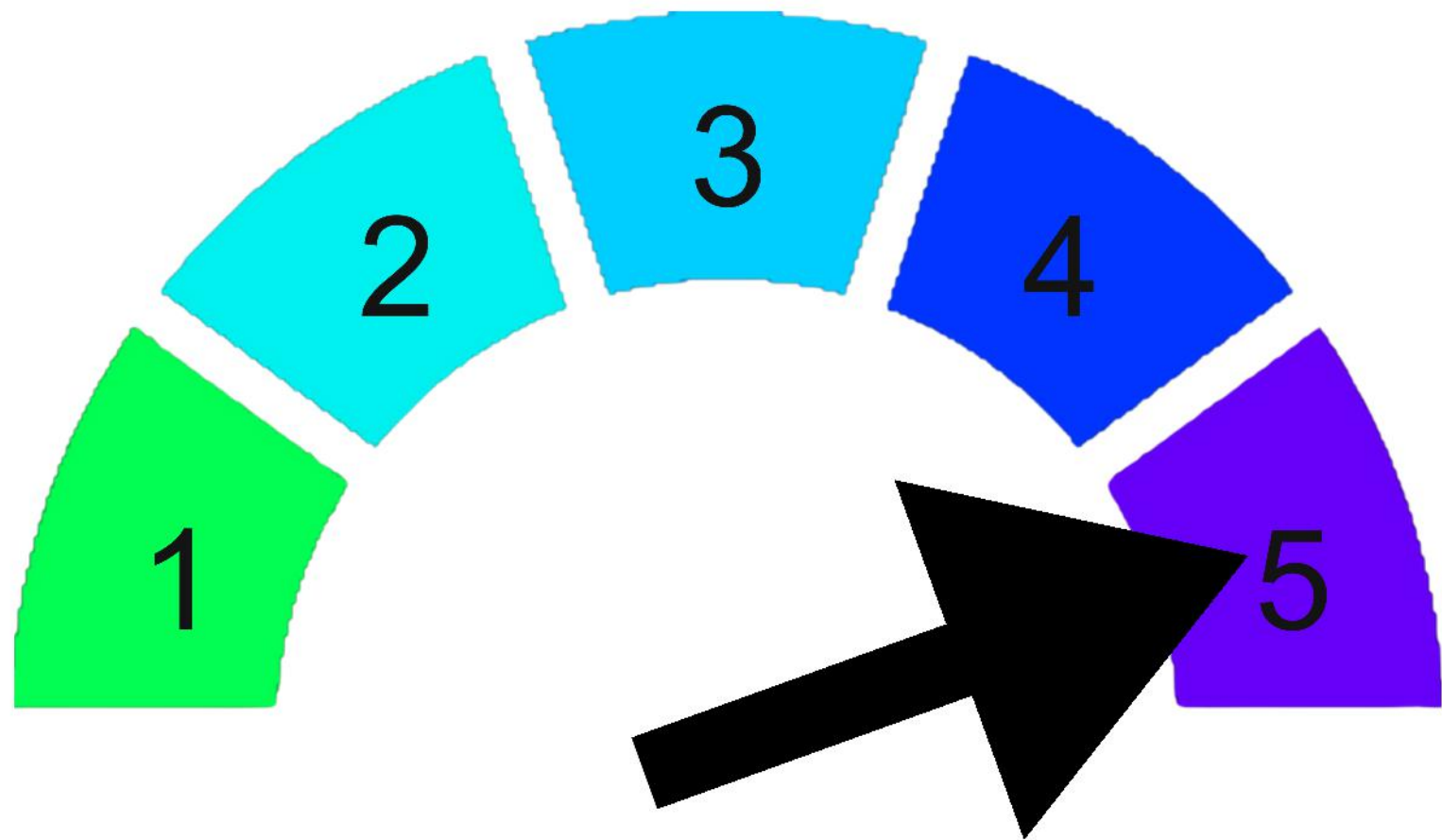

Indonesia

- Ratified the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) through Law No. 7/1984
- The Ministry of Women Empowerment and Child Protection
- National Gender Mainstreaming Policy (Presidential Instruction No. 9 of 2000)



- The Federal Constitution of Malaysia prohibits discrimination based on gender. Federal Constitution. Article 8(2).
- The National Policy on Women and Action Plan aim to integrate women into all sectors of development.

Papua New Guinea



- The Family Protection Act 2013 addresses domestic violence and aims to protect victims.
- Implemented the National Public Service Gender Equity and Social Inclusion Policy, which promotes diversity and respect within government agencies.



- The Magna Carta of Women (Republic Act No. 9710) is a comprehensive women's human rights law.
- The Gender and Development (GAD) Budget Policy mandates that at least 5% of government agency budgets be used for gender-responsive programs.
- Philippine Commission on Women.



- The National Policy on Gender Equality and Women's Development 2016-2020 seeks to promote women's rights and gender equality.
- Solomon Islands Ministry of Women, Youth, Children and Family Affairs.

Timor Leste



- Timor-Leste has ratified CEDAW and implemented the Law No. 7 Against Domestic Violence in 2010.
- The National Action Plan on Gender-Based Violence outlines strategies to combat violence against women (2012).
